162 LOCAL GOVERNMENT (ACCESS TO INFORMATION) ACT 1985

RESOLVED That under Section 100A(4) of the Local Government Act 1972, the press and public be excluded from the meeting for the following items of business on the grounds that they involve the likely disclosure of exempt information as defined in Paragraph 7 of Part 1 of Schedule 12A of the Act.

163 APPEAL AGAINST THE SUSPENSION OF HACKNEY CARRIAGE DRIVERS LICENCE

The Head of Technical Services submitted a report asking Members to consider whether a Driver's Hackney Carriage Drivers Licence should be suspended in circumstances where he had contravened a licence condition by flying the flag of St George from his taxi in June 2004, following which the Drivers Hackney Carriage Licence had been suspended for seven days. The Head of Technical Services reported that the Driver had already served two days of his suspension.

The Driver spoke against the suspension of his Hackney Carriage Drivers Licence.

Members asked a number of questions about the case which the Driver, the Senior Solicitor, the Head of Technical Services and the Hackney Carriage Inspector answered.

The Chairman requested that the driver withdrew from the meeting so that Members and Officers could discuss the appeal in private. Upon reaching a decision, the Driver returned to the meeting and the Chairman announced the decision of the Committee.

A Member left the meeting during consideration of this case.

RESOLVED That under Section 61, Sub-Section (1)(B) of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 there is considered to be a reasonable cause for the suspension of the Drivers Hackney Carriage Drivers Licence for a further five days, as two days had already been served, as the flag of St. George had been flown by the driver in contravention of the Council's conditions.

RESOLVED That under Section 61, Sub-Section (1)(B) of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 there was considered to be reasonable cause for the suspension of the Drivers Hackney Carriage Drivers Licence for 28 days.
