## Declarations of Interest

Councillors should not act or take decisions in order to gain financial or other material benefits for themselves or their spouse, civil partner or person with whom they are living with as a spouse or civil partner. They must declare and resolve any interests and relationships. The Chairman will ask Members if they have any interests to declare in respect of items on this agenda, under the following headings:

- (a) Disclosable Pecuniary Interests (DPI) under the Localism Act 2011. The nature as well as the existence of any such interest must be declared. After declaring a DPI, the Member must leave the meeting and not take part in the discussion or vote. This applies even if there is provision for public speaking.
- (b) Disclosable Non Pecuniary Interests (DNPI) under the Code of Conduct adopted by the Council in May 2012. The nature as well as the existence of any such interest must be declared. After declaring a DNPI interest, the Member may stay, speak and vote on the matter.
- (c) Where it is possible that a fair-minded and informed observer, having considered the facts would conclude that there was a real possibility that the Member might be predetermined or biased the Member should declare their predetermination or bias and then leave the meeting while that item is considered.

**Advice to Members**: If any Councillor has any doubt about the existence or nature of any DPI or DNPI which he/she may have in any item on this agenda, he/she should seek advice from the Monitoring Officer, the Head of Legal or from other Solicitors in Legal Services as early as possible, and in advance of the meeting.

# Modern day commemorative plaques to encourage tourism via social media platforms

It was voted on and agreed on 18 March 2021 at the Eastern Area committee, that a proposal to site plaques at places of interest be taken to Cabinet for consideration.

# Bus services between Faversham villages and rural areas – next steps

At our September meeting we passed a motion which included the following proposal: That an investigation/report be made into reviewing existing community transport models to see what might be suitable for the Eastern area.

Nothing has been done since to move this proposal forward. In the meantime the government has announced a new national bus strategy, there have been reductions in local services along the A2 and the borough's draft local plan has proposed that there should be significant development along the length of the A2 which should increase demand for public transport. As a result it is probably helpful to bring the issue back to the committee to see what members want to do next.

# Possible options could include:

- Making improved bus and other community transport a priority for the committee during 2021/22 and funding the production of a report on improving transport links within the area.
- Identifying to the cabinet that improving bus and related community transport services is a priority for the area and that we would like to see the Borough work with partners to improve bus services along the A2 and to find ways of networking local villages in with those services.
- Writing to Kent County Council requesting more information on how they can support the development of better bus services in Eastern Swale.

But members may have other suggestions.
