No.	Item	Background	Progress on actions
1.	Heritage issues	Cabinet adopted a Heritage Strategy and Action Plan on 18 March 2020. The Action Plan contains a programme of Conservation Area reviews. It has been suggested by the Cabinet Member that the Area Committee may want to fund CA reviews for areas which are outside of the planned programme of reviews in the Action Plan.  As it was noted in the minutes of the last meeting that there were no suggestions regarding additional conservation area reviews, the Chair proposes bringing this item forward at a later meeting to see if any proposals have been come forward.	The Chair reminds members to let her know if they have any suggestions.
2.	Brown tourism signs	To commence an audit of existing local brown signs in concert with parish councils.  Cabinet adopted a Visitor Economy Framework Action Plan on 28 October 2020. This includes a medium-term action to undertake a wayfinding audit of signage and identify any gaps. The delivery partners identified for this action are: SBC; town and parish councils; Visit Swale; Kent Highways; and local businesses. 3.	Siting of plaques at places of interest	At the March meeting the Chairman proposed that the Eastern Area Committee took a proposal to Cabinet for the funding of plaques to be sited at places of interest to promote tourism and for historical information. The Chairman suggested the proposal could boost the economy by drawing interest to certain attractions. The Chair subsequently attended Informal Cabinet on 26 April and presented her proposal for a plaque scheme. Cabinet Members were supportive of this proposal and confirmed that any plaques should be funded by the Area Committee.  The Chair asked for any suggestions of sites to be emailed to her and she will bring costings back to the September meeting.	The Chair will provide an update on the siting of plaques at places of interest. Mr Chris Bichard, the CEO at SEC Works in Faversham will be in attendance to present some sample plaques and answer any questions.
